## IS THERE CONNIVANCE BETWEEN HUKKA BARS & COPS?

**PRAYAGRAJ:** Is there any sort of connivance between some cops and the Hukka Bars which are illegally being run in Prayagraj and being possibly protected by the men in uniform? This suspicion arises on reading about the Allahabad SSP asking all the SHO's to submit an affidavit to the effect that no hukka bar is operating in their area. This became evident when one such Hukka Bar was raided in Civil Lines. After that such Hukka bars have been spotted elsewhere too and action taken. In the latest late-night operation in Naini the other day, two Hukka Bars were raided, six persons were arrested. Two KG of marijuana was seized from one of the Hukka bars along with many hookahs, pipes, flavours.

**Pune:** On the www.cara.nic.in, the Indian prospective adoptive parents if interested to adopt an



orphan or abandoned or surrendered child shall apply for the same to Specialised Adoption Agencies through Child Adoption Resource

Information and Guidance System.

The Specialised Adoption Agency or the impaneled social worker of the State Adoption Resource Agency or District Child Protection Unit shall counsel the prospective adoptive parents during the home study. The Home Study Report shall remain valid for three years.

Adoption of a child by prospective adoptive parents, after completion of registration and Home Study Report, shall depend

upon availability of a suitable child. Seniority of prospective parents shall be from the date of uploading of documents and completion of the process. The child shall be taken in pre-adoption foster care by the prospective adoptive parents within ten days from the date of matching, after signing the pre-adoption foster care undertaking in the format provided in Schedule VIII. The court shall hold the adoption proceeding in-camera and dispose of the

## Patna administration identifies all 96 UK returnees

**Patna:** Patna district administration on Thursday identified all the 96 people who had returned to the state capital from United Kingdom (UK) from November 21 to December 21.

"On Thursday, we could finally trace the 96 people who had arrived Patna from UK recently. Many have moved to other states and even returned to UK. The district administration officials of the states where they have migrated to have been informed and the

district magistrates asked to administer them tests. Besides, testing of those who are in Patna is being done," said Patna civil surgeon Dr Vibha Kumari Singh. She, however, did not disclose the states to which the people had migrated on the grounds that the list was long.

## UK flight ban: DGCA to frame rescheduling, refunding norms

**Mumbai:** With India extending the suspension of flights to and from the United Kingdom (UK) by another week, in the wake of a new variant of Covid-19 virus, the aviation regulator- Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA), is now considering new norms for rescheduling and cancellation of flights, as many fliers have been forced to either cancel or postpone their flights.

Arun Kumar, director-general of DGCA said that the regulator will look into the flight cancellations and

rescheduling caused due to extension of temporary flight suspension on UK routes. The circular issued



by the DGCA on Wednesday read, "...the complement authority has further extended the temporary suspension of

## All you need to know about night curbs in Delhi today, tomorrow

**New Delhi:** The Delhi government announced restrictions on the gathering of more than five persons in public spaces in the city from Thursday 11pm (December 31) to Friday 6am (January 1), and from Friday 11pm (January 1) to Saturday 6am (January 2). But the government has clarified that public spaces do not include licensed places such as hotels, bars, restaurants; they will be open. The government also said that there are no restrictions on private places. Here's all you need to know about the curbs:

At licensed places, it will be mandatory to follow social distancing rules and wearing of masks. Owners and managers of those places will have to scan the body temperature of the visitors at the entry points.
